## **A Ticket to Something Positive**

The Southern Shores Police Department is introducing a new incentive based policing program that rewards its citizens for doing something positive. The police are generally known for only being around when something "bad" happens. But we want people to know, especially young ones, that we recognize and appreciate when someone follows the "rules" and does the right thing. So, in an effort to teach the public at large that getting a ticket from a police officer is not always a bad thing, Southern Shores Police will now be issuing "Positive Tickets." In coordination with Rita's Ice Custard Happiness at the Marketplace in Southern Shores, the recipient of a Positive Ticket can turn that ticket in at Rita's Ice for a frozen treat at no cost to the ticketholder.



The first official recipients of the new Positive Tickets were Michaela (7) and Meredith (5) Koltz, the daughters of Eileen and Michael Koltz of Southern Shores. Michaela and Meredith were outside and saw sparking power lines which caused a brush fire at a residence on Ocean Boulevard on June 22, 2012. The girls immediately told their mother who called 911. The quick thinking and fast response of these two young ladies prevented what could have been a serious loss of property and possibly lives. They are a textbook example of who the Positive Ticket is meant for. Thank you Michaela and Meredith!

## § 14-410. Manufacture, sale and use of pyrotechnics prohibited; exceptions; permit required; sale to persons under the age of 16 prohibited.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, it shall be unlawful for any individual, firm, partnership or corporation to manufacture, purchase, sell, deal in, transport, possess, receive, advertise, use, handle, exhibit, or discharge any pyrotechnics of any description whatsoever within the State of North Carolina.
- (a1) It shall be permissible for pyrotechnics to be exhibited, used, handled, manufactured, or discharged within the State, provided all of the following apply:
  - (1) The exhibition, use, or discharge is at a concert or public exhibition.
- (2) All individuals who exhibit, use, handle, or discharge pyrotechnics in connection with a concert or public exhibition have completed the training and licensing required under Article 82A of Chapter 58 of the General Statutes. The display operator or proximate audience display operator, as required under Article 82A of Chapter 58 of the General Statutes, must be present at the concert or public exhibition and must personally direct all aspects of exhibiting, using, handling, or discharging the pyrotechnics.
- (3) The display operator has secured written authority under G.S.  $14 \square 413$  from the board of county commissioners of the county, or the city if authorized under G.S.  $14 \square 413(a1)$ , in which the pyrotechnics are to be exhibited, used or discharged. Written authority from the board of commissioners or city is not required under this subdivision for a concert or public exhibition provided the display operator has secured written authority from The University of North Carolina or the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill under G.S.  $14 \square 413$ , and pyrotechnics are exhibited on lands or buildings in Orange County owned by The University of North Carolina or the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
- (a2) Notwithstanding any provision of this section, it shall not be unlawful for a common carrier to receive, transport, and deliver pyrotechnics in the regular course of its business.
- (a3) The requirements of this section apply to G.S.  $14\Box 413(b)$  and G.S.  $14\Box 413(c)$ .
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S.  $14\square 414$ , it shall be unlawful for any individual, firm, partnership, or corporation to sell pyrotechnics as defined in G.S.  $14\square 414(2)$ , (3), (4)c., (5), or (6) to persons under the age of 16.
  - (c) The following definitions apply in this Article:
- (1) Concert or public exhibition. A fair, carnival, show of any description, or public celebration.
- (2) Display operator. An individual issued a display operator permit under G.S.  $58 \square 82A \square 3$ .
  - (3) State Fire Marshal. Defined in G.S.  $58 \square 80 \square 1$ .
